.Mountain High School Referral and Program Information 2019-2020

The purpose of Mountain High School is to provide students and high schools with meaningful alternative options.

- 1. The decision of whether or not a student will be accepted into Mountain High School will be based on the student's needs and goals in conjunction with attendance patterns, discipline needs and social emotional needs.
 - The credit rubric will only be used as a piece of the student's overall information to determine the most appropriate program or schedule needs of each individual student.
 - The ability of the student to graduate by the end of the SY or the Sept. 30th date will not prevent acceptance.

- All students being referred to MHS must be accepted through the DSD Placement Committee.
- All students must have a parent/guardian attend a mandatory parent meeting prior to beginning Quick Start.
- 2. ALL students are expected to attend school and earn credit, regardless of the program in which they are enrolled. MHS Programs include day school, Independent Study, Satellite, a combination of the three, Independent Study by Appointment Only or Transition Program.
 - Attendance and consistent credit earning is required to remain at Mountain High School.
 - MHS uses a pyramid of interventions in working with all students.
 - Non-attending or non-credit earning students may be referred back to their boundary school or Adult Ed if students are not responsive to MHS interventions.
- 3. Complete Quick Start
 - All Students must attend each day of quick start to be eligible to begin day school.
 - Students who fail to complete 2 quick starts in a row **WILL BE** referred back to their boundary school.
- 4. Students must have completed all safe-school mandates, as determined by the District Case Management Team and with their sending school, prior to registering at Mountain High School.
- 5. Transition Program- placement is determined in the Davis School District Placement Meeting.
 - The purpose of transition is to provide a means for accelerated credit recovery for students as they transition into MHS Day School or Adult Ed.
 - Students may be referred for Transition through the end of traditional schools the 3rd term.
 - 10th Grade Students may be referred to the MHS Transition Program beginning 2nd Semester
 - Students who are very deficient in core areas or chronically absent students will be placed in Transition
 - A parent/guardian and student must meet with an administrator for a Transition mtg with an MHS admin prior to beginning the Transition Program
 - Students will be required to demonstrate credit earning and/or attendance by meeting the contract requirements prior to being eligible to begin Quick Start for transition into day school
 - Transition to day school
 - Must complete quick start prior to beginning MHS regular day school
 - $\circ~$ Earn core credit to get into day school- specific credit/ attendance contract- overseen by administrator
 - \circ ~ Up to 2 mini term probationary period
 - $\circ \quad \mbox{ Parent must attend mandatory MHS Parent Mtg. }$
 - Transition FROM day school- Credit/ attendance contract overseen by administration
 - $\circ \quad \ \ \text{To adult ed- focus on core credits}$
 - \circ 2 mini terms to meet credit goals
- 6. MHS Summer School
 - Is open District Wide, at no cost, for current 10th-12th grade students.
 - Referrals are made by school counselors, beginning in May.
 - Credits will be entered by the MHS Counselor and communicated to the home school counselor.
